Introduction

Tanta University adopts Egypt's Sustainable Development Vision 2030 (The New Republic) launched by President of the

Republic. Believing in the role of Egyptian Universities in addressing national issues, especially the issue of illiteracy that real risks to poses growth and development, **Tanta**



University plays a great societal role to eliminate ignorance, poverty, and disease, as a partner in society that aims to raise awareness among citizens and to achieve Egypt's Vision 2030. This is accomplished through training and education in the neediest villages with the help of university students who teach the skills of reading, writing, and numeracy. Tanta University students support learners through the comprehensive development convoys organized by the University. Thus, learners can get better job opportunities through acquiring the basic skills of small projects with support from most faculties of the university.



A New Approach for Training and Educating Adults in Rural and Poor Areas

1. Project Summary:

The project of "A New Approach for Training and Educating Adults in Rural and Poor Areas" adopts a comprehensive and integrated methodology for adult education so that they can acquire the skills of Arabic language and numeracy with the help of university students, as most of the villages have many university students. They contribute to eliminating illiteracy through training and educating the illiterate in rural and poor areas to have an illiteracy-free family, then an illiteracy-free village, and finally illiteracy-free Egypt.

2. Project Description:

Tanta University students participate in educating illiterate people in Egyptian families, and raising their cultural awareness based on the protocol signed between Tanta University and the General Authority for Adult Education. Moreover, the project aims to achieve education and self-development of mothers with the help of their sons and daughters who study at Tanta University, in the villages which are in a bad need for development.

3. Project Objectives:

The project aims to:

- 1- Enhance learning of reading, writing, and numeracy skills with the help of university students in villages which are in bad need for development.
- 2- Support participants, especially females.
- 3- Provide training opportunities at Tanta University for students to be teachers for adults.
- 4- Granting learners the Literacy Certificate; thus, helping them to find job opportunities.
- 5- Offering university students a job, as teachers for adults, with a financial bonus.



Implementation Mechanisms of the project "A New Approach for Training and Educating Adults in Rural and Poor Areas"

Signing a protocol with the General Authority for Adult Education



Believing in the social role of Egyptian universities in addressing national issues, especially the issue of illiteracy because of the real risks

it poses to growth and development of Egyptian society, Tanta University signed a cooperation protocol with the General Authority for Adult Education on December 25, 2018 for one renewable year coping with Egypt's vision 2030 in order to



increase participation of university youth in facing illiteracy through educating illiterate persons in Egyptian families, and to achieve sustainable development in line with the New Republic.

Decrees issued University Council to address the problem of illiteracy and to encourage students to participate:

- -A decree was issued by University Council in its session held on September 15, 2019 stipulating that educating (2) illiterate persons aged 15 or more per an academic year is a graduation prerequisite for graduation from faculties of Education, Arts, Specific Education, Physical Education, Commerce, Law, and Agriculture, with effect from the academic year 2019/2020.
- -The university established the Center for Adult Education and Continuing Learning in 2019 in line with Egypt's vision 2030 and its most significant goals:
- Meeting the needs of illiterate adults.
- Organizing student classes.
- Alphabetical and computer literacy.
- Raising awareness about the issue of illiteracy through education and training programs.
- * In its session held on December 30, 2020, University Council issued a decree approving educating one illiterate person only, instead of two, as a prerequisite for graduation of final-year students from faculties of



Education, Arts, Specific Education, Physical Education, Commerce, Law, and Agriculture in the academic year 2020-2021 due to circumstances of COVID-19 pandemic.

- * In its session held on December 30, 2020, University Council approved giving a financial reward of 100 EGP for each student who educates one illiterate person at least in the academic year 2020-2021. The reward is given to the first 3000 students to meet this condition.
- * In its session held on June 29, 2021, University Council issued a decree approving addition of the subject of Literacy to the elective courses stipulated in bylaws of the faculties.
- * In its session held on July 28, 2021, University Council approved:
- Adding a field about literacy in the clearance letter of each graduate ratified by University Vice Dean for Community Service and Environmental Development based on statements approved by the General Authority for Adult Education.
- Giving the student a certificate of success to be submitted to the Armed Forces and postponing issuance of graduation certificates until the literacy requirement is met.
- Registration of the students, who have completed literacy tasks, in the database of Systems Development Unit in coordination with the Information Technology Units of the relevant faculties.
- * In its session held on November 30, 2021, University Council approved:
- Including the rest of faculties namely Medicine, Pharmacy, Dentistry, Nursing, Engineering, Science, and Computer and Information in the national project of literacy. Each student at the previously mentioned faculties must educate one illiterate person at least per an academic year as a graduation prerequisite.
- In addition, establishment of a Literacy Unit at each faculty carrying out the literacy project was recommended.
- * In its session held on March 30, 2022, University Council approved appointing Dr. Waleed Samir, Associate Professor at Faculty of Education, as General Coordinator for Literacy Project at Tanta University.



* In its session held on March 26, 2019, University Council issued a decree to allocate ten minutes in every lecture to raise students' awareness about the importance of the literacy project in cooperation with the General Authority for Adult Education.

* Financial rewards given by the University

Finally, to motivate students to participate in the literacy project, a decree was issued by University Council in its session held on May 31, 2021, to approve giving them financial rewards, as follows:

Expenses of training courses at University Centers

1- In the case of the student educating more than 5 illiterate persons in each academic year in addition to the annual minimum required, that is educating 2 illiterate persons per an academic

year; the university shall pay 90% of the expenses of the student's training courses at university centers.

2- In the case of the student educating 5 illiterate persons per an academic year, the



university shall pay 50% of the expenses of the student's training courses at university centers with a maximum of 1200 EGP to be used during one academic year.

- 3- In the case of the student educating 4 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university shall pay 30% of the expenses of the student's training courses at university centers with a maximum of 600 EGP.
- 4- In the case of the student educating 3 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university shall pay 20% of the expenses of the student's training courses at university centers with a maximum of 300 EGP.



Expenses of University Hostels

- 5- In the case of the student educating more than 5 illiterate persons in each academic year, the university will exempt the student from 80% of the expenses of University Hostels in the following year.
- 6- In the case of the student educating 5 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university will pay 70% of the expenses of University Hostels in the following year.
- 7- In the case of the student educating 4 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university will pay 50% of the expenses of the University Hostels in the following year.
- 8- In the case of the student educating 3 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university will pay 25% of the expenses of the University Hostels in the following year.

Tuition fees

9- In the case of the student educating more than 5 illiterate persons in each academic year, the university will pay the student's tuition fees in the following year.

10- In the case of the student educating 5 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university will pay 70% of the student's tuition fees of the following academic year.



- 11- In the case of the student educating 4 illiterate persons
- per an academic year, the university will pay 40% of the student's tuition fees of the following academic year.
- 12- In the case of the student educating 3 illiterate persons per an academic year, the university will pay 20% of the student's tuition fees in the following academic year.





announcement methods

* The decrees and motivational incentives offered by the university to its students were printed in a flyer to illustrate them.

Illiteracy-Free Gharbia

- 1- Every university student must educate 2 illiterate persons at least per an academic year as graduation prerequisite.
- 2-A student gets a financial incentive of 250 EGP for each successful learner.
- 3- Learners of the literacy project must be 16 years old or more.
- 4- Learners of the literacy project can be factory workers, hospital workers, neighbors, uneducated relatives, drivers, and other illiterate individuals who will be educated.
- 5- An exam is held for learners three months after signing the contract and enrollment at the literacy project.
- 6-The exam place is determined according to the learner's address in coordination with the teacher (the university student).



Papers to be presented by the student:

- A. (5) photocopies of the national ID card of the university student.
- B. (5) photocopies of the University card of the student.
- C. (2) photocopies of the student's visa card.
- D. (1) photocopy of the national ID card for each illiterate person.
- To help students to register at the literacy project as a basic requirement for graduation, it was decided to open Exam Centers for learners of the literacy project with effect from Sunday, January 16, 2022.
- Regarding students at Sibirbay Campus, exams are conducted at the Faculty of law.

Tanta University Gains the 3rd Rank in Literacy

Tanta University President, Prof. Mahmoud Zaki, announced that the university gained the third rank at the level of Egyptian universities in literacy according to the results announced in April 2021.

Prof. Mahmoud Zaki asserted that the university, with the help of its human cadres of faculty members and students, continues to implement the national project of literacy as it is a national duty and the basis for development.

Prof. Emad Etman, Vice President for Community Service and Environmental Development, declared that the university was ranked third at the level of 25 governmental universities after Mansoura and Zagazig universities, according to the achievement report issued by the General Authority for Literacy and Adult Education. He thanked students, academic staff members, and administrative staff responsible for the implementation of the project.

University Vice President pointed out that this success has been achieved in the framework of social role played by Tanta University and its great efforts in the field of literacy and adult education, in coordination between Environmental Affairs Sector at the University and Gharbia branch of the Literacy Authority. He added that literacy is a national responsibility of all organizations, bodies, and universities to



achieve advancement of society, and elimination of illiteracy, particularly in rural and remote areas.

Tanta University Gets the 1st Rank in Literacy at the Level of Egyptian Universities

Tanta University organized a ceremony on the occasion of obtaining the first rank in literacy at the level of Egyptian universities, during

which Prof. Mahmoud Tanta University Zaki, President. honored participants of the adult literacy and education project in attendance of Prof. Tarek Gharbia Rahmy, Governor; Prof. Ashour Amry, Executive Manager



of the General Authority for Adult Education and Deputy Minister of Education; Prof. Hamdy Shaaban, Vice President for Community Service and Environment Development; Prof. Mohammed Hussein; Vice

In the speech he delivered, Prof. Mahmoud Zaki affirmed that the university is keen on enhancement of Egypt's Vision 2030 and contribution to implementation of the human development strategy launched by President\ Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi. Thereupon, the university is carrying out an integrated plan to support the national project for literacy and adult education coping with its strategy of disseminating knowledge and eliminating ignorance. This strategy is a part of the university's pioneering role in community service. In addition, University President pointing out that literacy is a national duty and the foundation of advancement.

He declared that Tanta University topped the list of universities by gaining the first place in the field of literacy and adult education at the level of Egyptian universities, with a total of 12,525 students according to the report of the July 2021 issued by the Authority for Literacy and Adult Education.

Furthermore, University President added that this achievement is considered a qualitative leap in the results achieved by Tanta University due to the strenuous efforts it exerts, and that it reflects the stature of Tanta University at the national, regional, and international levels.




