

## **Continuation of the Implementation of the Cooperation Protocol Between Tanta University and the General Authority for Adult Education**

The second awareness seminar was held at the Faculty of Agriculture, Tanta University, on Sunday, September 29, 2019, for 901 students from the fourth year of study.

During the seminar, the attendees were introduced to the Authority and its role, as well as the cooperation protocol signed between the Authority and Tanta University. The students were also informed about the literacy eradication project in Gharbia Governorate and were encouraged to contribute to reducing the illiteracy rate in the governorate.

Students were motivated to participate by highlighting the financial incentive provided for each student who successfully teaches a person to read and write within the boundaries of Gharbia Governorate.

Furthermore, the students were made aware of the decision issued by the University Council of Tanta University, which stipulates that each student must eradicate the illiteracy of two individuals per academic year as a graduation requirement.
