Report on the Convoy No. 60 in Kafr Koreineta Village in Al-Mahalla District on Saturday, February 29, 2020

Under patronage of Prof. Magdi Sab', University President, and Prof. 'Emad 'Etman, University Vice President for Community Service and Environmental Development, Tanta University organized a comprehensive medical convoy in Kafr Koreineta village in Al-Mahalla district on Saturday, February 29, 2020. It was inaugurated by Prof. Ahmed Zaki Mansour and Prof. Sahar Mohey Al-Din Hazza', Vice Dean of Faculty of Medicine for Community Service and Environmental Development, in attendance of Mr. Mohammed Abdel Aziz Ghazy, General Manager of Environmental Projects, and Mr. Maher Hossny Sa'd, General Manager of Community Service.

Patients who visited the clinics were examined and given medicaments for free. They were 1741 cases. 23 of them were transferred to University Hospital to get needed checkups and to continue treatment for free.

In cooperation with Veterinary Medicine Directorate, the University organized a veterinary convoy where medicaments of examined animals were distributed for free.

The total cost of comprehensive medical convoy in in Kafr Koreineta Village in Al-Mahalla District was 150 thousand pounds.

During the convoy, lectures on environmental awareness were given in attendance of academic staff from faculties of Pharmacy, Medicine and Nursing and Deputy of Environmental Affairs Authority. Prof. Sahar Hazza', Vice Dean of Faculty of Medicine for

Community Service and Environmental Development at Tanta University, delivered a lecture on infection control, its causes, common diseases in this period of the year, how to detect coronavirus, methods of prevention and how to control its infection. In addition, Dr. Randa Al-Dib, Manager of Childhood and Maternity Center at the University, gave a lecture on "Unknown Slimming Drugs and their Hazards on the Young" and "Importance of Talking to Children to Solve their Problems" Moreover, Ms. Shimaa Sheikhon from Environmental Affairs Agency delivered a lecture on dangers of plastic.

In the framework of participation of Tanta University in the presidential initiative "Go Green", the University planted many fruitful trees in the village and in the adjacent villages.

Furthermore, Faculty of Specific Education and Faculty of Physical Education took part in the convoy and discovered talented students after conducting physical and artistic tests.

As part of the Social Solidarity Convoy and in cooperation with the University and Social Affairs Sector, Social Solidarity Directorate considered needy cases and distributed 150 blankets to 150 poor families in the village.

In cooperation with the General Authority for Literacy and Adult Education, a classroom for literacy was inaugurated in the village. 50 citizens applied for literacy test.
