

Report on Convoy No. 57 Sent to Mahallat Zeyad Village in Samanoud District on Tuesday, January 28, 2020

Under patronage of Prof. Magdi Sab', University President, and Prof. 'Emad 'Etman, University Vice President for Community Service and Environmental Development, Tanta University organized a comprehensive medical convoy in Mahallat Zeyad village in Samanoud district on Tuesday, January 28, 2020.

The convoy was inaugurated by Prof. Ahmed Zaki Mansour and Prof. Sahar Mohey Al-Din Hazza', Vice Dean of Faculty of Medicine for Community Service and Environmental Development, in attendance of Mr. Mohammed Abdel Aziz Ghazy, General Manager of Environmental Projects, and Mr. Maher Hossny Sa'd, General Manager of Community Service.

The convoy was inaugurated in attendance of 26 doctors who are academic staff at Faculty of Medicine in addition to some academic staff from Faculty of Pharmacy who supervised distributing medicaments that costed 60 thousand pounds for free. The clinics were visited by 1346 patients. 21 of them were transferred to University Hospital to get needed checkups and to continue treatment for free.

During the convoy, awareness lectures were given about issues that village community is interested in and methods of dealing with them in attendance of academic staff from faculties of Nursing and Specific Education and deputy of Environmental Affairs Agency. The lectures were given by Dr. Loly Mohammed Shawky from Faculty of Nursing Tanta University, Dr. Amal Said 'Okda, Lecturer of Educational Media at Faculty of Specific Education at Tanta

University; and Ms. Shimaa Sheikhon from Environmental Affairs Agency.

In collaboration with the General Authority for Literacy and Adult Education, a classroom was inaugurated in the village for conducting literacy test. Sixty five citizens applied for the test.

In cooperation with Veterinary Medicine Directorate, the University organized a veterinary convoy in Mahallat Zeyad in Samanoud District where medicaments of examined animals were distributed for free.

In cooperation with the University and Social Affairs Sector, Social Solidarity Directorate considered needy cases and distributed 150 blankets to 150 poor families in the village.
