



## Convoy No. 74 in Al-Gharib Village in Zefta District on Thursday, February 16, 2021

Under patronage Prof. Mahmoud Zaki, Tanta University President, and Prof. Emad Etman, University Vice President for Community Service and Environmental Development, the Sector of Community Service and Environmental Development at Tanta University organized a comprehensive medical and environmental convoy in Al-Gharib village in Zefta District on Thursday, March 25, 2021in the framework of the presidential initiative *Decent Life* that aims to achieve sustainable development in Egyptian rural areas and to relieve the suffering of the needlest citizens. The convoy was organized in cooperation with executive bodies in the governorate namely Education Directorate, Health Directorate and Veterinary Medicine Directorate.

The convoy was organized with participation of faculties of Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, and Nursing in attendance of academic staff members and doctors. Required medicaments were





given for free and 1116 patients were examined. There was a dentistry vehicle in cooperation with Faculty of Dentistry.

## **The Medical Convoy**

The convoy was inaugurated by Prof. Sahar Mohey Al-Din Hazzaa, Vice Dean of Faculty of Medicine for Community Service and Environmental Development; Prof. Sahar Al-Haggar, Vice Dean of Faculty of Pharmacy for Community Service and Environmental Development; Prof. Om Ibrahim Al-Saie, Vice Dean of Faculty of Nursing for Community Service and Environmental Development; in attendance of Mr. Mohammed Abdel Aziz Ghazy, General Manager of Environmental Projects, and Mr. Maher Hosny Saad, General Manager of Community Service. 1116 patients visited the clinics and were examined.

## **The Veterinary Convoy**

In cooperation with Veterinary Medicine Directorate in the village, the University organized a veterinary convoy as part of the presidential initiative *Decent Life* for development of Egyptian rural areas. Medicaments of examined animals were distributed for free.
